The pandemic affects us all, though by no means all equally. What was unequal before becomes even more unequal in this crisis: Worldwide, more and more people are threatened in their existence and lack access to health care. The billions from the first economic aid packages mainly benefit companies. Investments in climate protection, the health care system, and the cultural and education sector are urgently needed.

At the same time, racism, anti-Semitism and conspiracy stories become more socially acceptable and threaten our collective coexistence. We resolutely oppose this.

It must not go on like this!

Many of us are at risk of being left behind: People without secure jobs who can no longer pay their rent or do not have a home, refugees who have to live in mass accommodation or are disenfranchised at Europe's external border, people who are subjected to racism, anti-Semitism and discrimination or even fall victim to right-wing, racist and anti-Semitic violence, members of Corona risk groups, victims of domestic violence and neglected school children.

Thereby it is mainly women who enable the implementation of the protective measures in the first place – in the care and retail sector as well as with childcare.

For a solidary society

Now we decide who bears the costs of this global crisis, who will come out of it stronger, and who weaker. Now we decide whether we manage to strive together towards an anti-racist, social and climate just society – for a better life for all. Even in this crisis we demonstrate that this can be handled with solidarity – we do not allow to be played off against each other

We demand:

- Better working conditions and good wages for all. Equal rights and safety measures for migrant employees
- Gender equitable distribution of care work
- Free health care for all and withdrawal of privatisation
- Safe and good housing for all: independent from one's financial situation and residence status
- Democratisation of the economy and more co-determination in the companies
- A tax policy which ensures the economically powerful and wealthy shoulder the costs of the crisis
- Socially and ecologically just aid packages for the economy
- Debt relief and support for countries particularly hard hit by the crisis
- For the right to protection and asylum – dissolution of housing that violates human rights – taking in refugees from the Greek camps now – solidarity knows no borders!
- Human rights must be the global benchmark in overcoming this crisis
- A societal pact against racism, anti-Semitism and right-wing terrorism
